



ACCESS for ELLs

- Is given annually to monitor student's progress in learning academic English
- Assesses the four language domains of listening, speaking, reading, and writing

Proficiency Level	Descriptor
1 – Entering	Knows and uses minimal social language and minimal academic language with visual and graphic support
2 – Emerging	Knows and uses some English and general academic language with visual and graphic support
3 – Developing	Knows and uses social English and some specific academic language with visual and graphic support
4 – Expanding	Knows and uses social English and some technical academic language
5 – Bridging	Knows and uses social and academic language working with grade level material
6 - Reaching	Knows and uses social and academic language at the highest level measured by this test

Analysis of Student Performance

- Most of our students (K-8) have overall scores in the range of 3 to 4, which means they are developing the necessary academic English needed to flourish in an English-speaking classroom.
- The scores by domain demonstrate strengths in listening and reading, ranging from 4 to 6.
- The scores by domain demonstrate that the most challenges for ELL students are in speaking and writing in English, but they are predominantly at level 3.

English Language Learner Strategies Used in Closter Public Schools

- Explicit language instruction
- Literacy-based lessons
- Culturally-responsive pedagogy
- Differentiated instruction
- Including increased opportunities for speaking and writing in English
- ESL teachers share ELL best practices with general education teachers
- Sheltered Instruction training (five hours) for general education teachers (K-8)
- After-School and Summer Academic Assistance Program for ELL students
- ESL teachers consulted with PreK teachers and parents of incoming PreK students to provide language support strategies
- ESL teachers led several parent information nights and provided Rosetta Stone access to parents
